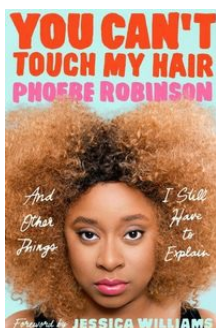


# YOU CAN'T TOUCH MY HAIR: AND OTHER THINGS I STILL HAVE TO EXPLAIN
