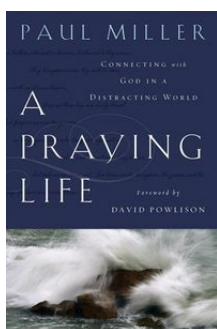


A PRAYING LIFE: CONNECTING WITH GOD IN A DISTRACTING WORLD
