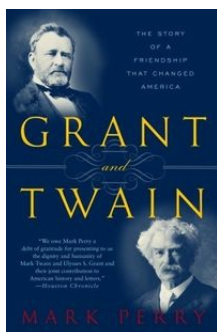


GRANT AND TWAIN: THE STORY OF AN AMERICAN FRIENDSHIP
